
YOUR COMMITMENT


ulfulling the expectation of ethical service requires:




WHAT DO YOU THINK?

WHAT DO YOU THINK?


Your family and friends ask you to help them with an issue they have with the Government.

You have come into the Government from the private sector. Your former employer does business with or is affected by the programs of our agency.


WHAT DO YOU THINK?

You play in a rock band/sing in a choir/participate in theater.


WHAT DO YOU THINK?

In your day-to-day work you may deal with government contractors or vendors, grantees or people who work for regulated organizations. Over time you may get to know these people more personally.


WHAT DO YOU THINK?
