SUBJECT: Annual Update of Post-Employment Component Designations

(18 U.S.C. § 207(c)) due to OGE by July 1, 2025

The Director of the U.S. Office of Government Ethics (OGE) may, upon a request made by an executive branch agency, designate a component of an agency as a separate department or agency ¹ for purposes of the post-employment restrictions applicable to "senior" employees. ²

By July 1, 2025, agencies that currently have such components designated³ must confirm to OGE in writing that their current designations are acceptable. Agencies that wish to request new designations should submit a request to modify the current designations. Agencies are encouraged to consider the effect of organizational changes to the agency or a designated component prior to responding.⁴

Any request to modify the current list of component designations should be submitted according to OGE's regulatory procedures.⁵ OGE requires each agency headquarters to submit a single written response on behalf of all of its components. No reply is required from agencies that do not have component designations and do not wish to request them.
